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Canyon County Inspection Policy:

Our expectation is that the permit holder will call for an inspection only when the work is ready for inspection. As our inspectors cover large geographical areas, it is most reasonable for them to plan a route for their day in the morning, then stick to that route. While we do document requests for AM or PM inspections, this does not mean the permit holder will have that inspection performed at the time requested, rather it informs the field inspector so that they can plan their route to accommodate that request where possible.

The county may take up to 2 days to complete an inspection. While Canyon County completes the vast majority of inspections on the date requested, in times of high demand or staffing shortages, some inspections may be pushed to the next day. In times of high demand, we try to give priority to time sensitive inspections and push inspections that might better wait a day. Those inspections that are pushed would be a priority the following day.

With regard to inspections related to concrete placement, permit holders may contact their inspector the day of the pour and inform them of the intended pour time. A tentative inspection time with the inspector could then be established. Depending on the inspector's schedule, the pour time may need to be adjusted.

Under no circumstance can the permit holder choose a particular inspection time without having prior approval from the office. As an expeditious route between all inspections on a given day is most economical, circumventing that route with arbitrary inspections times is not practical.

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
